Old St. Mary's exists to proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, Savior, and God. As we grow in holiness by being His disciples, we invite all to give themselves totally to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. With Mary, our Mother and the Patroness of Old St. Mary's, we join our voices with those of many generations in praying: "We are the servants of the Lord. Let it be done to us according to God's word" (see Luke 1:38).

St. Mary's is on the National Register of Historic Places and is the oldest standing house of worship in the city of Cincinnati. Many German immigrants settled in this area, and to this day this neighborhood is called "Over-the-Rhine." Here, in 1841-42, the German Catholics of Cincinnati built St. Mary's Church, reportedly using bricks baked in their own kitchen ovens.

In this way they preserved the memory of the great churches of Germany, with their elaborate stained glass windows and massive pipe organs. The parish continues to preserve the rich liturgical, musical and cultural heritage of Catholic tradition. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered in Latin, German, and English. St. Mary's is known for its splendid music (chant), its Marian statues, and its privileged high altar. St. Mary's is supported by the prayers and sacrifices of its people. You can help Old St. Mary's preserve the riches of the past and minister to the needs of the present by adding your support.

## ASH WEDNESDAY - FEBRUARY 17, 2010

On this day all the faithful according to ancient custom are exhorted to approach the altar, and there the priest, dipping his thumb into ashes previously blessed, marks the forehead of each the sign of the cross, saying the words:

*"Remember man that thou art dust and unto dust thou shalt return."*

In addition to our 12:10 p.m. Mass, there will also be a 7 p.m. Latin Mass. Ashes will be distributed at 12:10 p.m. and 7 p.m. Masses. This is a day of fast and abstinence.

**Cornelius Verdonck** (c.1563 - 1625) Franco-Flemish composer.

A pupil of Cornet and Waelrant, he was from 1579 in the private service of various wealthy citizens in the Low Countries. He published chansons (whose preface deplors the poor state of music in the Netherlands) and madrigals. In 1599, he participated in the elaborate entry procession of the newly-married Archduke and Archduchess into Antwerp, writing a mote for the occasion: it was performed by a six-member boys' choir mounted on the back of an elephant, which rode along with the Archduke and Archduchess (accounts differ as to whether it was a real or artificial animal). It is the only known motet composed for performance on an elephant.

Verdonck was a representative of the Italian madrigal style. Stylistically he was relatively conservative, shunning the innovations of the early Baroque. Verdonck also wrote sacred music, including several motets and a Magnificat, which are scored for four, five, or six voices. The Magnificat (1585, for five voices) survives in the original copper engraving.
