Old St. Mary's exists to proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, Savior, and God. As we grow in holiness by being His disciples, we invite all to give themselves totally to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. With Mary, our Mother and the Patroness of Old St. Mary's, we join our voices with those of many generations in praying: "We are the servants of the Lord. Let it be done to us according to God's word" (see Luke 1:38).

St. Mary's is on the National Register of Historic Places and is the oldest standing house of worship in the city of Cincinnati. Many German immigrants settled in this area, and to this day this neighborhood is called "Over-the-Rhine." Here, in 1841-42, the German Catholics of Cincinnati built St. Mary's Church, reportedly using bricks baked in their own kitchen ovens.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES

Novena of Our Lady of Lourdes began Thursday, Feb. 2 and will end Friday, Feb. 10. The Feast Day is Saturday, Feb. 11, 2012, which is also World Day of the Sick. Novena prayers are available at the tables in church. Please join the Parish in praying for the sick, both physically and, more importantly, spiritually.

In 1858, a young peasant girl named Bernadette witnessed many apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the grotto at Lourdes, which is now an important pilgrimage site known for the miraculous healing power of its waters. "I am the Immaculate Conception," were the words of the visions, confirming for many Pope Pius IX's declaration of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. Our Lady of Lourdes is patroness of the sick.

OLD ST. MARY'S PIPE ORGAN RESTORATION

PHASE ONE TOTAL: \$110,000

The total cost to refurbish the entire Austin Pipe Organ is \$355,000. The work will be completed in three phases. The first and most important phase is to replace the console which includes the keys, wiring and stops for a cost of \$110,000. We have collected \$51,000 in donations towards this effort. This amount reflects the \$12,000 which Old St. Mary's had in its Restoration Fund prior to this fundraising effort. This Restoration money will now be used to restore the organ.
