NOTE from the PASTOR



First of all, I wish each of you a very Happy New Year on behalf of everyone at the Oratory. I pray that the Lord blesses us in this new year and that we all face with courage whatever difficulties may present themselves and use them as a means of a grace!

A new year is always a time to examine our lives, priorities, and where we hope to go. Please also examine your spiritual lives, remain fervent, and strive to grow in a particular virtue this year. These are good spiritual practices to remember as we begin a new beginning.

The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name, a Feast we celebrate on January 2 on the traditional calendar and on January 3 on the revised calendar. This month is an excellent time to meditate on how we use the Holy Name, the name of God, Mary, and any of the saints. It becomes easy to use such names casually. This is not a good habit to form and becomes so easy and often starts so simply.

The name of Jesus — and connected to that of all holy people and objects — is the name by which we are saved. As

St. Paul says, it is the name by which all knees should bend. So examine how you may misuse such names and begin only to use them when praying, talking with the Lord, or teaching others about the goodness of the Lord.

The name of Jesus and also of Mary are powerful names. At which the very gates of hell shake and at which Satan flees. These names have won significant victories, protect us from sin, and give us the graces and virtues we need to live a holy life. So have respect for these names in all ways.

It is a sad reality that in Quebec, their very cuss words developed in French around religious figures and names due to the anti-clerical atmosphere of the time. May we not allow such practices to form within us. Be very careful in our speech and the example we set for others.

May the Lord, in this month of January and this new year, give us the grace to do so, so that whenever we mention the Holy Name, we may at least interiorly bend our knees for the name that has given to us salvation. Have a blessed month and new year!


Adorers Needed!

Important Old St. Mary's Parking Update

For now, we ask for your cooperation with the following two requests: Please refrain from double parking in the 12th and Main Street parking lot. Double parking cannot be effectively managed in this lot and has caused issues on several occasions in the past. At this time, double parking is only allowed in our large Clay Street parking lot. If you decide to double park, please be respectful of other parishioners and have your vehicle out of the right-of-way immediately following Mass. Gates on the Salvation Army Clay Street parking lot will be locked at 2:00 pm each Sunday. Any vehicles remaining in this lot after that time will be towed at the owner's expense. It is imperative that we do not take advantage of the agreement in place for use of this lot. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Remember that on Sundays, the meters are not in effect until 2:00 p.m. You can park in any metered spot for free until then. Be sure to take advantage of this!

PLEASE BE CAUTIOUS when leaving personal items in the pews, especially purses or wallets. Use prudence so that you are not a victim of theft! Also, petty theft has been on the rise and cars broken into. **DO NOT** leave any items visible in your cars when you park for Mass — do not lead others into temptation!

We will have the annual Blessing of Throats on **Friday, February 3**, after Masses. We will bless again on **Sunday, February 5**. Confessions could be limited as a result—we apologize for any inconvenience.

Merry Christmas! It has been a very busy but very satisfying season for the musicians here. We were so delighted to debut the Laudate Pueri Children’s Schola at the Musical Oratory of Advent and singing carols prior to Midnight Mass this past December, and they are looking forward to providing music for three liturgical events in our parishes this coming season: at the end of February, for the evening Mass opening our Forty Hours devotion on the feast of Saint Matthew, for the sung Mass at OSM on the First Friday of May, and then on Sunday, May 14 at Sacred Heart Church for their Mass with May Crowning.

The Schola represents an important and often-neglected component of the great legacy of Catholic sacred music, namely, the emphasis that has historically been placed on providing an opportunity for young people to receive a thorough musical education in the context of providing music at the very highest level for the liturgy. Right now, our Schola stands at 21 members, but if we can grow, we will be able to provide more targeted opportunities for growth and for learning for all age groups, and hopefully expand into offering a high school program for graduates of the earlier years. If you have any young men and women in your family ages 8 to 12 who would be interested in this opportunity, I would strongly encourage you to reach out to me or Sophia Decker for more information.

The Marian antiphon, *Alma Redemptoris Mater*, that we began singing at the beginning of Advent will continue to be sung all month, as the echoes of Christmas continue through the time after Epiphany. Don’t be surprised to find that Christmas in the traditional calendar does not end as abruptly or instantaneously as you may be used to. Meditation on Christ’s birth and His hidden years will continue to occupy us in part until the beginning of February, even as our attention is also called to His later life and ministry. This is not so much the logic of narrative storytelling, in which one thing must come after another in sequence, as it is the logic of prayer, in which we


continually return in awe and loving contemplation to the life-giving mysteries of Our Lord’s life.

The musical echoes of Christmas and Epiphany end definitively on February 2 in the traditional calendar, when we celebrate the feast of the Purification of Our Lady, complete with the beautiful blessing of candles, remembering His coming into the world as a “light of revelation to the Gentiles,” as the elderly St. Simeon described him on that occasion. Simeon’s canticle, “Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace...”, known as the *Nunc Dimittis* from its Latin incipit, is sung in the Divine Office every night at Compline, and features heavily in the liturgy of Candlemas. In addition, we will be singing as motets some Candlemas responsories from the English Sarum liturgy, set by Thomas Tallis. Strong historic devotion to Our Lady in England had brought this feast to a place of great prominence in England, and these are among the most iconic output of these composers. It is not to be missed.

I am so grateful, as are all the musicians, for the loving and supportive community that we find here. I was especially delighted by the magnificent attendance at the Musical Oratory of Advent. We had over 100 more people in the pews this year than last. A great deal of effort goes into making this event as beautiful as possible, to lift hearts and minds to God, and so it was very gratifying to see so many people taking advantage of the opportunity.

Last, but not least, in addition to the parish choirs and the children’s schola, it is in a particular way the singing congregation that makes a church musician’s work so rewarding. An entire room chanting the responses is powerful, and the great hymns were all written with a congregation’s voice in mind. It is very special to hear them as they should be heard. Thank you all for helping our parish to pray in this beautiful way, one that is so often missing in a culture that has sadly grown uncomfortable with the idea of singing together.
